Labour Migration and Development: The Philippine Experience

It is estimated that there are around 200,000 Filipino migrants in the UK, the biggest grouping in Europe. A large proportion of Overseas Filipino Workers (OFWs) are women, the majority of whom work in the public service sector.

The event will feature a debate with a number of speakers who will address the impact of migration on the Philippines in relation to development, especially health delivery, and the consequences in the Philippines at the loss of 12 million of its people. The meeting will also look at the links between UK government immigration policies and the Philippine government labour export policies, and their respective impacts on the rights of migrant workers and their families.
